You will raft down one of the world's most dramatic and rugged canyons while receiving personal instruction from Craig Childs who has published more than a dozen books on adventure, wilderness, and science. To experience the natural world from the bottom of Hells Canyon, the deepest river canyon in the United States, is sure to stir the imagination and provide stories for a lifetime. Hosting the trip is Winding Waters Expeditions who will expertly navigate the river, provide delicious meals, and bring you to the best camp spots on the river. The work that will emerge is sure to paint a complex beautiful landscape, true writing of place.

Explorer and story-teller **Craig Childs** has published more than a dozen critically acclaimed books, including his most recent, *Atlas of a Lost World: Travels in Ice Age America*. His work has appeared in the *New York Times*, *Los Angeles Times*, *Men's Journal*, and *The Sun*, and he is a contributing editor for *Adventure Journal Quarterly*. Childs lives in Western Colorado and teaches writing for both University of Alaska in Anchorage and Southern New Hampshire University.

From Craig Childs:

This will be an elemental workshop where we focus on writing in and about the natural world. We will explore the use of narrative and storytelling, as well as techniques of field recordings translated into pieces of writing. We will learn how to see story in place, how to discern details in the environment to use in our work. Turning experience into article, essay, poem, or story will be our goal. I want you to come out of this with solid material.

Any kind of writer is welcome, fiction or non, any level, but come prepared to put pen to paper. Importantly, this is a hand-writing workshop. You'll need to bring two journals, one that can be scribbled and scratched in, another for final work. So, choose your pens or pencils wisely. They'll have work to do.

Alcohol on the Trip

Alcohol is not included with your trip cost. You are welcome to bring your own libations. Winding Waters will provide ice for clinky drinks. They ask all beer to be in cans for safety reasons. Glass wine bottles are accepted. For your convenience, Winding Waters does sell a nice selection of canned beer and box wine that you can order at this link:

If you order here, simply select paying at the Pre-Trip Meeting. If you are bringing your own alcohol, please bring it to the river the morning of your trip launch.

Medical

Winding Waters staff are all certified first responders. In the case of a life-threatening emergency you will be flown or jet boated out of the canyon.

Pre-Purchase Fishing Licenses: If you're interested in fishing on your trip, we suggest you pre-purchase your fishing license online. Please have a printer at hand to print off your license. https://or.outdoorcentral.us/or/license. Winding Waters will provide fishing gear for the trip.

Tipping/Gratuities: Many of Winding Waters' guests ask about and appreciate information on the custom of tipping. Winding Waters' guide crew will work hard to make your Outpost experience the best it can be. While it is not expected whatsoever, if you wish to tip, we recommend treating it like a restaurant (anywhere from 10-15% of your trip cost for the crew). You can either give your lead guide cash at the end of the trip or have us here at Fishtrap put it on your credit card. The gratuities will then be distributed among the guide crew, food manager, and shuttle driver(s). And again, please know this is not expected.

Interesting Hells Canyon Information

- Hells Canyon is the deepest river gorge in North America at 7,993 feet and approximately 10 miles wide
- It was added to the National Wild and Scenic River System on December 1, 1975
- Total length of Hells Canyon: 78.7 miles from Hells Canyon Dam to Heller Bar
- The Bonneville Flood (approximately 14,500 years ago) is believed to be the second largest single flooding event in geologic history and estimated to move water at 33 million cubic feet per second (cfs) through present-day Hells Canyon. Today, the Snake River in Hells Canyon typically flows between 10,000 and 50,000 cfs. The floods widened Hells Canyon more than deepened it. Many of the benches in Hells Canyon today are remnants of these floods.
- The first people in Hells Canyon are believed to be of the Nez Perce Tribe.
- In 1925 Amos Burg made the first documented float through Hells Canyon in a wooden canoe.

Terms, Conditions, and Refund Policy

These Terms and conditions are valid for each attendee registering for the 2019 Outpost Writing Workshop.

Outpost is held on the Snake River bordering Idaho and Oregon. This is an outdoor setting with inherent risks, hazards, and dangers. All registrants agree to follow the rules and policies of Winding Waters River Expeditions and sign a waiver. No pets are allowed.

Fishtrap's Outpost Writing Workshop Cancellation and Refund Policy:

If, for any reason, you need to cancel your plans to attend Outpost, our refund policy is as follows:

Fishtrap registration includes a \$100 nonrefundable deposit as part of the total fee. Registrants cancelling Outpost registration before April 1, 2019 will be issued a full refund minus the deposit. Registrants cancelling registration from April 1-May 31, 2019 will be issued 50% refund of the total registration fee minus the deposit. No refunds will be issued after June 1, 2019.

In the unlikely event that Outpost is cancelled, all registrants will have the option of receiving a full refund, including deposit, or receiving registration credit for the following year's Summer Fishtrap Gathering or Outpost event. Fishtrap is not responsible for any travel costs.

Fishtrap reserves the right to refuse to admit or remove any participant or refuse registration to any participant who may be disruptive to the event. This policy is in place to ensure safety and of all participants, instructors, and staff. Registrants refused admittance at registration will receive a full refund. Registrants removed from Outpost while the event is in progress will not receive a refund.

This refund policy covers all fees paid to Fishtrap for registration, meals, and lodging. Changing or canceling lodging reservations made with other parties is the responsibility of the registrant.
