Important Notes

Summer Fishtrap takes place at the historic <u>Wallowa Lake Lodge</u>. This location provides many benefits to our writers and guests including its close proximity to Wallowa Lake, hiking trails, camping sites at the State Park, and local attractions. You will have full access to the outdoor deck, lawn, and 24-hour access to the lobby. Rooms and cabins are also available for participants to reserve for the week by calling the Lodge directly at 541-432-9821.



Afternoon panels, craft talks, and evening events all take place in the large tent set up on the beautiful back lawn. Morning writing workshops take place at faculty cabins within walking distance of the Lodge.

Local bookstore, <u>The Bookloft</u> will be on site in the Lodge and will have faculty books and merchandise for sale. Contact The Bookloft if you would like your publications available during Summer Fishtrap.

Meals, Lodging, and Travel

LODGING

Wallowa Lake is a popular summer tourist destination and accommodations fill up quickly. We recommend reserving your lodging early.

Wallowa Lake Lodge

Rooms and cabins are available at <u>Wallowa Lake Lodge</u>. They can only be reserved for Summer Fishtrap week by calling the Lodge directly at 541-432-9821.

Cabins, B&Bs, and More

The Wallowa Lake area offers many other lodging options to fit most any budget from cabin rentals at the lake to motels and B&Bs in the nearby town of Joseph. Contact the <u>Wallowa County Chamber of Commerce</u> for more information. Be sure to tell them you're going to Summer Fishtrap!

Tent Camping and other Affordable Options

Fishtrap was not able to reserve group camping at <u>Wallowa Lake State Park</u> this year but you can reserve individual camp spots and yurts through the <u>Wallowa Lake State</u> <u>Park reservation system</u>.

<u>Wallowa Lake Methodist Camp</u> has a variety of affordable tent sites, bunkhouse lodging, and yurts for rent that are a short walk from Wallowa Lake Lodge. Contact Peggy Lovegren at <u>wallowalakecamp@gmail.com</u> or call 541-432-1271 for rates and availability.

MEALS

You have lots of flexibility during the week. Wallowa Lake Lodge will offer full meal plans available to purchase the first day of Summer Fishtrap. In addition, the Lodge will also offer a-la-carte choices to mix and match and pay as you go as well as a nightly happy hour social. You are also welcome to bring your own food and dine with everyone in the Lodge.

Monday, July 10

Summer Fishtrap Check-In begins at 2:00pm at Wallowa Lake Lodge. At check-in, you'll receive a Summer Fishtrap Program that elaborates on the schedule, provides additional maps, and information on activities. Unless otherwise noted, please meet at **Wallowa Lake Lodge** for all evennts including meals, off-camp departures, andl other scheduled programming.

Workshops: Your Summer Fishtrap Welcome and first Workshop Session begins Monday afternoon, July 10 at 4:30pm. Workshops continue 9:00am–12:00pm, Tuesday through Saturday, except for Youth Workshops, which conclude with an afternoon presentation on Friday, July 14. Workshops are held at your instructor's cabin, which is an easy walk from Wallowa Lake Lodge. Let us know if you have any mobility concerns. We can make arrangements to give you a lift.

Afternoon Events: Every afternoon we offer a craft talk, breakout session, or a panel discussion. There is also time for hiking, napping, a dip in Wallowa Lake, and plenty of time to write. You'll get a detailed schedule on the first day of Summer Fishtrap in our printed program. Daily schedules will be posted each morning in the Lodge lobby.

Open Mic: The open mic is an opportunity to gather and share excerpts of your work-in-progress in a comfortable and supportive atmosphere. Join us Tuesday through Thursday from 4:30–5:30pm. All are encouraged to participate and attend. Look for sign-ups each morning—they fill quickly.

Evening Events: Each evening, we feature our Summer Fishtrap faculty in readings and presentations. Invite your friends and family to attend, as these events are free and open to the public! We also have plans to make these available online. This is always a wonderful way to wrap up the day.

Weekend Highlights: Join us Friday, July 14, in celebration of Summer Fishtrap's theme of "Generations" with a keynote address by Jamie Ford. There are many other events during the weekend including the Youth Showcase and Yearlong Writers Workshop readings. We'll have a full schedule for you in June.

What to Pack

Clothes: Wallowa County weather is unpredictable. July will likely be warm, but you should be prepared for any weather from hot to freezing. Walking shoes or hiking boots, a good warm cap, and rain gear are strongly encouraged. Dressing in layers is often the best option. Evening events take place outdoors under the Big Tent. When the sun goes down, temperatures drop quickly. Be sure to bring a jacket or even a blanket. Summer Fishtrap is nestled on the forested south end of Wallowa Lake, so bring your suit if you like to swim!

Altitude and Sun: Wallowa Lake rests at 4,440 feet. Those of you coming from sea level may feel the effects of the altitude change for the first 24-48 hours. Most likely, you'll feel it when climbing up trails, or just feel a little tired. The antidote is to hydrate: drink water and lots of it. Sunscreen is also key!

Digital devices: A laptop or tablet can come in handy but many of our participants and faculty choose to go back to the old days and hand write in a notebook. It's a wonderful opportunity to slow down and be low-tech. WiFi is available at Wallowa Lake Lodge, but cell service is often unreliable. If you do work best on a keyboard, pack a flash drive or external hard drive to save, share, and print files. Have a plan for storing your device when not in use. The Lodge does not have storage lockers and power outlets are limited.

Copy Machine/Printer: Fishtrap will have a self-service copy machine/printer available for use with limited hours of operation and minimal tech support. Additional printing services are available in Central Copy & Shipping in Enterprise.

Lodge Facilities & Guidelines

Accessibility: Wallowa Lake Lodge's main room and backyard are ADA accessible. Because of the rustic nature of the Wallowa Lake area, not all workshop cabins are ADA accessible. If you have mobility or other disability concerns, please contact us. We'll do our best to make sure you are able to fully participate in all Summer Fishtrap programming. We will also have a disability coordinator onsite during Summer Fishtrap to assist you.

It's a short walk on a paved path from the Lodge to the shores of Wallowa Lake. The Wallowa Mountains offer miles of hiking trails and the lake community offers many attractions from the Wallowa Lake Tramway to putt-putt golf. Shopping, restaurants, museums, and art galleries can also be found six miles down the road in the town of Joseph or twelve miles to Enterprise.

Alcohol: Wallowa Lake Lodge will open their bar from 5:00pm until 7:30pm each evening. Please remember that this is an all-ages gathering with minors on site. Outside alcohol is not allowed on the Wallowa Lake Lodge grounds.

Smoking: Smoking or vaping of any substance is not allowed at Wallowa Lake Lodge. You can puff in public places off property but please keep Wallowa Lake beautiful and discard cigarette butts properly.

Pets: We love our pets but they are not allowed at the Lodge. Some of the nearby cabin rentals do allow dogs. Check with them for their pet policies. Service animals are allowed at Wallowa Lake Lodge but may note be allowed in your workshop cabin. Please get in touch if you will have a service animal accompanying you to Summer Fishtrap.

Books: Have you published a book you want to make available at Summer Fishtrap? Our local bookstore, <u>The Bookloft</u>, will have a table featuring titles by faculty, guests, and participants. Contact Becky Wyland for details at <u>manager@bookloft.org</u>.

Music: What would Fishtrap be without music? Bring your instruments. We hope sunny afternoons are filled with melodious voices on the Lodge's beautiful grounds.

Virtual Access


One of this summer's workshops will take place online. This group will meet on Zoom, and will have online access to events and readings during the week.


About this Place

Why a Code of Conduct is Important

Thank you for being a respectful member of the Fishtrap community. Fishtrap is committed to maintaining a welcoming and accountable environment for all who interact with Fishtrap and our programs as we carry out our mission to promote clear thinking and good writing in and about the West. Our staff is dedicated to serving our community near and far with integrity and kindness. We believe all people deserve to participate in our programs free from harm, harassment, and abuse. We invite you to create the Fishtrap community with us, sharing the understanding that we are all responsible for ourselves and must work together to thrive.

Join Us

We ask that you join our efforts to foster a healthy community both online and offline by practicing the following: respect self and others, adhere to applicable laws, embrace anti-harassment*, prohibit sexual misconduct**, and maintain honesty in communications.

Please acknowledge harassment does not include respectful disagreement or critique in good faith. Reading, writing, and other creative pursuits inherently involve risk and exposure to controversial, challenging, and sometimes offensive language.

How to Respond

If you are the witness or recipient of any harmful behavior, please report your experience to any member of the Fishtrap staff, an instructor, or a member of the Fishtrap Board. Whether or not you feel personally affected by harmful or disruptive behavior, reporting your experience and observations helps others who may be affected differently. Reports will be directed to Fishtrap's Executive Director who will follow up on the issue with further conversations, requests to stop the behavior, discipline and possible removal of the perpetrator from the situation. Fishtrap staff, instructors, and Board will maintain confidentiality for all parties involved.

If you are asked to stop harmful behavior by a member of the Fishtrap staff, faculty, or Board of Directors, you are expected to comply immediately. Violating these expectations may be considered retaliation and result in expulsion from the event and/or future programs without a refund, reimbursement or pay. Fishtrap may involve the police or other resources when necessary or requested.

If it is determined that harassment has occurred as defined by applicable law, Fishtrap may hold the perpetrator legally liable for their actions under state or federal anti-discrimination laws or in separate legal actions.

If the Executive Director is the recipient, perpetrator or witness of harmful behavior, the report will be directed to the Board President.

*Harassment can be based on age, gender, sexual orientation, race, ethnicity, culture, national origin, religion, body type, personal appearance, physical or mental ability, socioeconomic status, marital status, political activities or affiliation, or any other basis proscribed by local, state, provincial, national, and federal laws and regulations.

Harassment can occur to any person, either in person or through online activities now known or unknown, and involve tactics such as trolling, stalking, using hate speech, threatening, intimidating, falsely accusing, reporting of false grievances, manipulating, or other means.

****Sexual misconduct** can be verbal or physical in nature, and involve behavior such as unwelcome advances, commentary, displays, gestures, inquiries or discussion of sexual activities, orientation or gender identity.

Terms and Conditions

Summer Fishtrap Terms and Conditions - Refund and Cancelation Policy

These Terms and conditions are valid for each attendee registering for the 2023 Summer Fishtrap Gathering of Writers conference.

Summer Fishtrap is held in an outdoor setting with inherent risks, hazards, and dangers. All registrants agree to follow the rules and policies and sign a waiver. No pets are allowed.

Summer Fishtrap Gathering of Writers Cancellation and Refund Policy:

If, for any reason, you need to cancel your plans to attend Summer Fishtrap, our refund policy is as follows:

Summer Fishtrap registration includes a \$100 nonrefundable deposit as part of the total fee. Registrants canceling Summer Fishtrap registration before May 1, 2023 will be issued a full refund minus the deposit. Registrants canceling registration from May 1-July 1, 2023 will be issued a 50% refund of the total registration fee minus the \$100 deposit. No refunds will be issued after July 1, 2023.

In the unlikely event that Summer Fishtrap is canceled, all registrants will have the option of receiving a full refund, including deposit, or receiving registration credit for the following year's Summer Fishtrap Gathering or Outpost event. Fishtrap is not responsible for any travel costs.

We encourage all participants to look into a Travel Insurance policy in the case that you are not able to attend due to circumstances beyond your control.

Fishtrap reserves the right to refuse to admit or remove any participant or refuse registration to any participant who may violate the Fishtrap Code of Conduct Policy who may be disruptive to the event. This policy exists to ensure the safety of all participants, instructors, and staff. Registrants refused admittance at registration will receive a full refund.

This refund policy covers all fees paid to Fishtrap for registration.

Notice of Non-Discrimination

Fishtrap prohibits discrimination on the basis of race, color, gender, national origin, religion, sexual orientation, disability, or age. Fishtrap will make reasonable modifications to policies and procedures to ensure that people with disabilities have an equal opportunity to enjoy programs, services, and activities. This policy applies to all Fishtrap administration, activities, and events and will be enforced for all employees, contractors, volunteers, and participants.

Photographs/Video/Audio Recordings

Participants are reminded that material presented at Summer Fishtrap is the intellectual property of Fishtrap. As a result, participants are prohibited from recording presentations in their entirety with the intent to distribute to others. The use of personal smart phones, cameras or video devices should be limited to recording snapshots or snippets for personal use, such as taking snapshots throughout the conference venue to support Fishtrap's efforts to convey the excitement of the event through posting on social media.
